

Curriculum to Support the Health of Educators: Easy-a Pilot 🔳 🗮 🔳 Program Evaluation

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Background & Purpose

- Non-communicable diseases account for 7 out of 10 deaths (40 million) annually in the United States.
- Drug overdose deaths have risen by over 30% in the United states in 2020; which may be associated with effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and the sudden environmental changes that have occurred.
- Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic educators were called upon to still work, with no support on how to handle working in a new context (i.e., working remotely and relying on technology).

- Activities workbook to support learning


Program Evaluation

- The Easy A curriculum was implemented over 9 ° weeks in a high school in the Pacific Northwest Region.
- Participants agreed to be a part of a program evaluation via a focus group
- Participants: 5 educators (3 female, 2 male).
- The focus group was conducted in person and audio was recorded with consent from all participants
- The audio recording was transcribed,
- Content analysis was conducted to find major themes on ways to improve the delivery of the Easy-A curriculum.

Results of Evaluation

Improvement of messaging and/or branding

- "maybe we didn't listen to what the message was going to be, we were like sweet....were going to do more stuff for kids and it just fell flat."
- Curriculum would be better implemented outside of a group setting
 - "being asked to share things or talk about our values. That's not something I want to do in this setting."
- Barriers to participating
 - "I honestly don't know what went where, and how it all followed each other ...it was all over the place"
- Appropriate content and activities
 - "that first one I was fired up. I was like this is great. I even brought up the stuff that next day to my health class and we were talking about it and I was like this is great, im going to be learning more stuff".



Importance to Physical Therapy

- The development of the Easy-A curriculum is an example of the impact that physical therapists can have outside the clinic within the public health arena.
- The curriculum involves interdisciplinary perspectives led by physical therapists that addresses populational health in various areas including exercise, nutrition, and pain.
- As the Easy-A curriculum grows, we hope to include other physical therapy perspectives to ensure we address populational health holistically.
